

**CHALLENGES TO EXCESSIVE MARITIME CLAIMS**  
**1 OCTOBER 2009-30 SEPTEMBER 2010**

<b>Country</b>	<b>Excessive Maritime Claim</b>
China*	Jurisdiction over airspace above EEZ; domestic law criminalizing survey activity by foreign entities in the EEZ
Cambodia*	Excessive straight baselines; authorization required for foreign warships to enter territorial sea or contiguous zone; security jurisdiction in contiguous zone
India*	Authorization required for military maneuvers in the EEZ
Indonesia*	Partial designation of archipelagic sea lanes
Liberia*	Excessive territorial sea claim
Iran*	Restrictions on right of transit passage through Strait of Hormuz to signatories of the United Nations Convention on Law of the Sea
Japan	Excessive straight baselines
Malaysia*	Authorization required for nuclear powered ships to enter the territorial sea; authorization required for military maneuvers in the EEZ
Maldives*	Permission required for foreign vessels to enter EEZ
Oman*	Requirement for innocent passage through the Strait of Hormuz (an international strait)
Philippines*	Excessive archipelagic baselines
Vietnam	Excessive straight baselines; authorization required for foreign warships to enter territorial sea and contiguous zone
